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Summary of Disability Resource Guide

for Individuals with Disabilities in the Upstate of South Carolina

The *Disability Resource Guide* was created out of a need our organization identified in our community. This guide will connect individuals in the Upstate of South Carolina with local service providers, state disability agencies and valuable resources and information for the lifespan of disability.

The *Disability Resource Guide* includes the contact information of organizations and agencies that support individuals with disabilities from birth through adulthood. Since 1 in 3 adults in South Carolina have a disability and 1 in 7 students have a disability, a tool like this is critical to bridge individuals with disabilities with the supports they need to be active participants in their community.

The information in this guide is divided into the following categories:

- **Adult Day Programs:** Provide care and social opportunities for adults during the day
- **Adult Residential Programs:** Provide housing for adults with varying levels of support
- **Assistive Technology:** Products that maintain or improve an individual's functioning
- **Community Based Services and Nonprofits:** Provide services and supports for individuals with disabilities, their families, caregivers and professionals
- **Education:** Provide products or educational services ranging from birth to higher education
- **Employment:** Provide training, internships and/or employment opportunities
- **Financial, Future Planning and Legal:** Provide services related to banking, savings, trusts, wills and eligibility for government benefits
- **Government Agencies:** Provide benefits and supports for individuals with disabilities
- **Healthcare:** Provide medical services to address health conditions related to disability
- **Recreation:** Provide social and leisure activities for individuals with disabilities
- **Support Groups:** Provide support for individuals with disabilities, their families and caregivers
- **Therapy & Early Intervention Services:** Provide behavioral, physical, occupational, speech and/or early intervention services
- **Transportation:** Provide transportation and equipment for individuals with disabilities
- **Other Local Businesses:** Business sponsors of the BRIDGED Disability Resource Expo

Child Find is an effort coordinated by local education agencies (LEAs) to identify, locate and evaluate all children and youth, from birth through age 21, with disabilities who are in need of special education and related services. A free appropriate public education is the right of every child with a disability. Anyone, including parents, teachers and others, can make a referral if it is suspected that a child has a disability at any time. Making a referral, regardless of the source, does not ensure the child will be evaluated, but does require the student assistance team to discuss the concerns and determine the next steps.

The populations served by DDSN include individuals with Intellectual Disabilities, Related Disabilities, Autism Spectrum Disorder, Traumatic Brain Injury, Traumatic Spinal Cord Injury and Similar Disabilities (disabilities affecting the brain or spinal cord which are not associated with the process of a progressive degenerative illness or disease, dementia, or a neurological disorder related to aging). Upon being determined eligible for DDSN services, a case manager can coordinate some limited services immediately, and developmentally delayed children (ages 3-6) can obtain immediate Early Intervention services. However, the most important services to meet an individual's lifelong needs (home and community based waivers and care facilities) are obtained through entrance into a Medicaid service program. The DDSN public service delivery system relies predominantly on Medicaid programs to leverage state funding to maximize services available to the individuals served by DDSN. As a result, individuals will need to obtain Medicaid eligibility to access the vast majority of services offered through DDSN. For middle and high schools, we offer a leadership development program. Programs highlight the definition of disability, disability history, assistive technology, careers, advocacy and empathy.

WHY ARE THESE PROGRAMS IMPORTANT?

Research shows that by age three, children notice physical disabilities and, by age four, they become fearful of differences. Since one in seven students are disabled, education about disability is critical. Disability awareness programs decrease bullying, fear and stigma and increase self-esteem and pride of students with disabilities. Also, studies show that disability awareness programs benefit all students and positively impact relationships between students with and without disabilities.
